

Article II: Terms of admission of members and their rights and obligations.

1. Regular Members:

All person who are eighteen (18) years of age and who subscribes to all the objectives of the Society is eligible to become a member. To become a regular member, he/she shall complete an application form prescribed by the Society with a fee and renewed annually. A regular member shall have all rights and privileges of the Society, right to be elected and hold office and voting rights. The secretary shall enter his/her name in the voting membership register.

2. Life Members

- a) Life membership may be conferred on any person who is a regular member of the Society in accordance with the above clauses and has made significant contribution to the Society. The life members are nominated on recommendation of the Board of Directors, approved by a resolution passed at the Director's meeting by a majority of not less than six (6) Board of Directors.
- b) The life members are exempted from paying any type of fees. The person nominated for life membership shall have all rights and privileges of the Society and have the voting rights.

3. All members are in good standing except a member who has failed to pay his or her current annual membership fee, or any other subscription or debt due and owing by the member to the Society, and member is not in good standing so long as the debt remains unpaid.

Article III: Privileges, Removal and Resignation of members.

1. The Board of Directors may withdraw the privileges of the Society from a member whose conduct has been considered to be unbecoming.
2. The Board of Directors, by a vote of two-thirds, would withdraw the privileges of the Society from a member of any class who willfully infringes the rules or by-law of the Society or in any way conducts himself or herself to an act in a manner prejudicial to the interest of the Society.
3. Before any motion or expulsion of any member is put before any directors meeting, notice of the motion of expulsion shall be supplied to the member concerned at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting, together with the particulars of all the charges made against him or her, and such a member shall be allowed to appear before such a meeting to answer charges made against him or her.
4. As per ARTICLE II, members shall be allowed to attend all general meetings of the Society. All members shall have access to properties owned by the Society in accordance with the rules and regulations governing thereof.
5. A member may resign from the society at his own goodwill by submission of a written statement.

Article IV: Liability of Members.

A member of the Society is not in his or her single capacity liable for any debt or liability of the Society, unless and otherwise such a member is proved to be responsible for any such debt or liability of the Society.
