

Article 111: Unalterable Clause

The purpose of the Society shall be carried on without purpose of gain for its members and any profits or other accretion to the Society shall be used for promoting its purpose. No members of the Board of Directors of the Society shall be paid any remuneration for service rendered to the Society but may be paid his reasonable expenses in acting as a director. **This clause unalterable.**

Article IV: Unalterable Clause

Upon winding up or dissolution of the Society, the assets remaining after payment of all costs, charges and expenses properly incurred in the winding up, including the remuneration of a liquidator, and after payment of any debts of the Society, shall be distribute to a charitable organization, or organization in British Columbia registered under the provision of the Income Tax Act of Canada, which shall designated by the Board of Directors of the Society. Any such asset which had originally be provided for specific under the provision of the Income Tax Act, carrying on work of a similar nature to such specific purposes. **This clause is unalterable.**

Article V: Fundamental nature of the Society

The society shall be fundamentally a Hindu religious and charitable organization with the purpose provided in Article II of this constitution. The deities of "Divine Mother Thurkadevi", "Lord Ganesha" and "Lord Murugan" shall be placed as the main deities in the Temple to represent the Saiva tradition of the Hindu Religion. Other deities in subsidiary altars may be determined by the Board of Directors. The worship and rituals carried on each altar shall be in accordance with the prescribed Hindu religious tradition. This clause is alterable.
